



Imperial Valley Continuum of Care Council Executive Board Membership Responsibilities

The Imperial Valley Continuum of Care Council (IVCCC) Executive Board has important responsibilities and decision-making authority on behalf of stakeholders, related to use of public funds invested in addressing a serious community concern, homelessness. IVCCC Executive Board Members observe the highest standards of ethical conduct in the execution of these responsibilities. A partial list of these responsibilities is below.

- A. Regional planning
- B. Monitoring community performance to end homelessness
- C. Establish and monitor project performance targets and metrics
- D. Approve IVCCC policies
- E. Approve Selection of and provide direction to funding applicants
- F. Select Executive Board Members annually and fill vacancies
- G. Authorize grant applications, raise and allocate funds, and approve sustainability plans
- H. Ensure equitable representation for various homeless subpopulations in planning and decision-making
- I. Build community awareness
- J. Liaise with Advisory Committees and community groups whose primary purpose is to address homelessness

Regular attendance and participation in board activities is required, and not be absent for three (3) consecutive meetings. Members of the IVCCC Executive Board must actively participate in 50% of meetings in order to remain in good standing. Upon placement on the IVCCC Executive Board, Board Members who are not current IVCCC members are required to join the IVCCC as a voting member.

In the performance of their duties, IVCCC Board Members carry out the IVCCC mandate to the best of their ability, maintaining the highest standards of integrity for actions with other members of the Board, IVCCC representatives, service recipients, service providers, and members of the public.
