IVCCC Funding Principles

- 1. Invest in programs that support Imperial County's service priorities: permanent housing, rapid re-housing, emergency shelters, transitional.
- Invest in programs that support Imperial County's homeless
 population priorities and align with HUD-recommended
 subpopulations such as veterans, youth, families and chronically
 homeless individuals.

IVCCC Funding Principles (continued)

- 3. Invest in programs that work towards eradicating homelessness in the region by addressing the underlying causes and lessening the negative impact on individuals, families, and community.
- 4. Invest in programs that address significant service gaps among the chronically homeless and establish accountable, long-term, and sustainable results.
- 5. Invest in programs that support the Housing First policy and emphasize on a comprehensive coordinated service delivery approach to wraparound services to ensure successful housing and self-sufficiency outcomes.

FY 2021 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)

- •The Continuum of Care Program is designed to promote community-wide commitment to the goal of ending homelessness; to provide funding for efforts by non-profit providers, states, Indian Tribes or tribally designated housing entities. Priorities include:
 - End homelessness for all persons experiencing homelessness;
 - Use a Housing First approach;
 - Reduce unsheltered homelessness and reduce the criminalization of homelessness;
 - Improve system performance;
 - Partner with housing and health agencies, including to leverage and coordinate American Rescue Plan resources;
 - Advance racial equity and addressing racial disparities in homelessness;
 - Engage people with lived experience of homelessness in decision-making.





Eligible Applicants

- Organization type:
 - Nonprofit organizations
 - State and local governments
- Demonstrate financial and management capacity and experience
- Submit required certificates (e-snaps application)
- Population to be served meets eligibility requirements
- Commitment to use Homeless Management Information System
- (HMIS) and Coordinated Entry



Target Populations

- HUD Categories of Homelessness:
 - Category 1 Literally homeless
 - Category 2 Imminent risk of homelessness
 - Category 3 (not eligible for CoC Program) Homeless under other Federal statutes
 - Category 4 Fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, human trafficking

Eligible Project Types - Renewals

Category	Project Type
Renewals	Expansion: projects that will increase the number of units, persons served, services provided to existing program participants, or to add additional activities.
Rene	Reallocation: CoCs may only reallocate eligible renewal projects that have previously been renewed under the CoC Program. Eligible activity can be combined with CoC bonus & reallocation.





Eligible Project Types – CoC Bonus

Category	Project Type
	Permanent housing-permanent supportive housing (PH-PSH) projects.
Sr	Permanent housing-rapid rehousing (PH-RRH) projects.
Bonus	Joint Transitional Housing (TH) and PH-RRH component projects.
CoC	Victim service providers may also request HMIS funds in their project application budgets to enter data into a comparable database.
